

Aluminum Fence Maintenance Guide

Aluminum fencing is strong, rust-resistant, and built to handle the elements with very little upkeep. With a few easy steps, your Capital Fence & Rail aluminum fence will maintain its strength, finish, and curb appeal for decades.

Routine Cleaning

- 1. Frequency: Twice a year or as needed
- 2. Tools Needed: Garden hose, mild soap, soft cloth or sponge
- 3. **Steps:**
 - 1. Rinse the fence with a garden hose to remove dirt and dust.
 - 2. Mix a mild soap solution (a few drops of dish soap in water).
 - 3. Wipe down with a soft cloth or sponge.
 - 4. Rinse thoroughly and allow to air dry.

Stubborn Spots

- Hard Water Spots: Wipe with a 50/50 mix of vinegar and water.
- Grease, Sap, or Sunscreen: Use a non-abrasive household cleaner (like Simple Green).
- Avoid: Steel wool, abrasive pads, or harsh solvents that could scratch the protective finish.

Seasonal Checks

- Spring: Inspect fence for shifting posts after winter frost. Tighten or reset if needed.
- Summer: Hose down to remove pollen, salt spray (in coastal areas), and dust.
- Fall: Clear leaves, branches, and organic debris from around posts.
- **Winter:** Remove snow piled against the fence. Avoid leaning heavy shovels, plows, or snow blowers against panels.

Preventative Care

- ✓ Keep lawn trimmers and shovels away from the fence to avoid scratches.
- ✓ Touch up any deep scratches with manufacturer-approved touch-up paint to protect against corrosion.
- ✓ Ensure sprinklers don't constantly spray the fence, which can leave mineral deposits.
- ✓ Keep vegetation trimmed back to prevent staining and scratching.

Quick Maintenance Checklist

Rinse fence regularly with a hose
Wash with mild soap twice a year
Wipe hard water spots with vinegar solution
Touch up scratches if needed
Inspect posts and fasteners each season
